Introduction

At Croskerrys we consider the privacy of our visitors to be extremely important. We respect your right to privacy and comply with our obligations under the Data Protection Acts 1988 and 2003. This privacy policy document describes in detail the types of personal information which is collected and recorded by Croskerrys and how we use it. Information Collected – Personal Data

This is data that identifies you or can be used to identify or contact you and may include your name, address, telephone number(s), email address, and such information as may be supplied to us about you by our client in the course of us acting for them. If we contact you, or you contact us, you may provide us with the information shown above together with information concerning your personal circumstances. Such information is only collected from you if you voluntarily submit it to us.

We will process any Personal Data you provide to us for the following purposes:

1. To provide you with information you have requested;
2. To contact you or send you correspondence if required

Information Collected – Non-Personal Data

We gather statistical and other analytical information collected on an aggregate basis of all visitors to our website. Most websites will do this. This Non-Personal Data comprises information that cannot be used to identify or contact you, such as demographic information regarding, for example, user IP addresses where they have been clipped or anonymised, browser types and other anonymous statistical data involving the use of our website.

We use the Non-Personal Data gathered from visitors to our website in an aggregate form to get a better understanding of where our visitors come from and to help us better design and organise our website.

Disclosure of Information to Third Parties

We do not provide Non-Personal Data to third parties, where such information is combined with similar information of other users of our website. For example, we might inform third parties regarding the number of unique users who visit our website, the demographic breakdown of our community users of our website, or the activities that visitors to our website engage in while on our website. The third parties to whom we may provide this information may include potential or actual advertisers, providers of advertising services (including website tracking services), commercial partners, sponsors, licensees, researchers and other similar parties.

We will not disclose your Personal Data to third parties unless you have consented to this disclosure or unless the third party is required to carry out work on behalf of our client (in such circumstances, the third party is bound by similar data protection requirements). We will disclose your Personal Data if we believe in good faith that we are required to disclose it in order to comply with any applicable law, a summons, a search warrant, a court or regulatory order, or other statutory requirement.

No Personal Data is ever sold to third parties.

Sale of Business

We reserve the right to transfer information (including your Personal Data) to a third party in the event of a sale, merger, liquidation, receivership or transfer of all or substantially all of the assets of our company provided that the third party agrees to adhere to the terms of the Website Privacy Policy and provided that the third party only uses your Personal Data for the purposes for which you provided it to us.

Security

Your Personal Data is held on secure servers. The nature of the Internet is such that we cannot guarantee or warrant the security of any information you transmit to us via the Internet. No data transmission over the Internet can be guaranteed to be 100% secure. However, we will take all reasonable steps (including appropriate technical and organisational measures) to protect your Personal Data.

Accessing Personal Data

Although we hold your Personal Data on file, we are Data Processors acting on behalf of our client, who is the Data Controller. Therefore, all Data Access Requests must be made by a debtor to the client (the Data Controller) who will in

turn instruct us to provide the information, which must be sent back to the client who will then send it on to the debtor. We never respond to a Data Access Request by furnishing any information direct to the debtor, and we must not.

Our Client has 40 days to comply with a Data Access Request and cannot request a fee in excess of €6.35.

We are not obliged to provide any Privileged Information, i.e. data or documents concerning our relationship with the client, for example invoices, statements, any information regarding our charges in the matter, or our service. Privileged Information will not be furnished.
